

# Green Caddis Larvae By David Chin Page 1

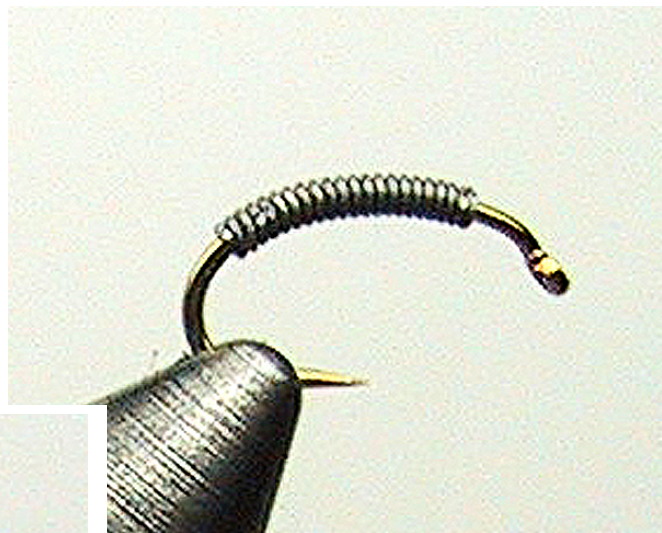


Tying size 14.  
Material:  
Hook: Caddis hook  
Weight: Lead .010  
Thread: Uni 8/0 Brown  
Body: Antron Yarn  
Thorax: Brown synthetic



## Lead weight. 1.2

Lead .010. Wrap from bend of hook .  
Leave 1/3 hook length for thorax.



## Cover lead with thread. 1.3

Cover all the lead with the thread and  
finish behind the eye.



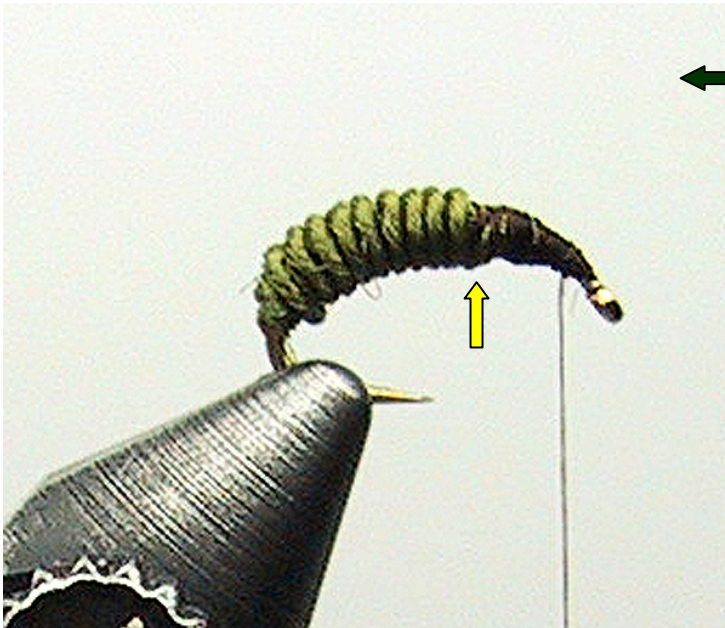
## Tying in the Antron. 1.4

Tie in antron at the front and wrap to the bend  
of the hook. Advance the thread to 1/3 behind  
the eye.





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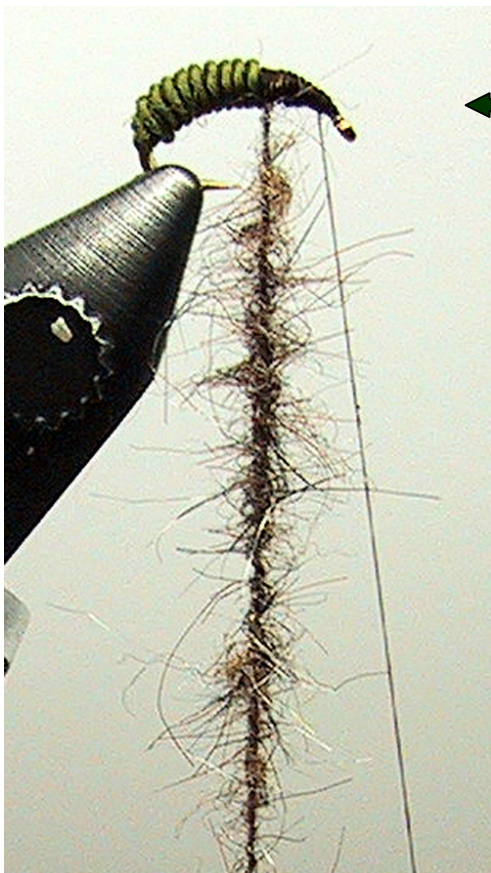


### Wrapping the body: 2.1

Start by twisting the antron to a tight rope. Use a clip or hackle pliers. After the antron has been twisted sufficiently, make a wrap while holding the rope tight at all time. Twist the antron after each wrap to maintain a tight rope. This will end with a segmented body. If you noticed that the wrap has become flat, unwrap and twist the rope, then continue. End the wrap at the Thorax. (yellow arrow) Bind down the antron with the thread.

### The thorax 2.2

The Thorax is buggy and thick. Use buggy synthetic mixed with dark color fibers. Hare's Ear fur with guard hairs can be also effective. This is spunned into a rope. Insert dubbing in a thread loop and spin it with a twister.

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### ← The Thorax. 3.2

Make at least 4 wraps with the rope.  
Move the fibers backwards with the off  
hand on each wrap. Tie off and trim .
